



## **DENNIS SNOWER**

Dennis J. Snower is President of the Kiel Institut für Weltwirtschaft and Professor of Economics at the Christian-Albrechts Universität zu Kiel.

As part of his research career, he originated the “insider-outsider” theory of employment and unemployment with Assar Lindbeck, the theory of “high-low search” with Steve Alpern, and the “chain reaction” theory of unemployment and the theory of “frictional growth” with Marika Karanassou and Hector Sala. He was a seminal contributor to the macroeconomics of imperfect competition, and has published extensively on labour economics, macroeconomic theory and policy, and the design of welfare systems. He has recently proposed a new explanation of the inflation-unemployment tradeoffs.

He has advised various European commission and various OECD countries on employment policy and welfare state policy. He has consulted for the IMF, World Bank, OECD, SNS, and UN. He has been a visiting professor at many universities around the world, including Columbia, Princeton, Dartmouth, Harvard, the European University Institute, Stockholm University, the Vienna Institute of Advanced Studies.
